MENTOR MATCHING PROCESS

One of the keys to successful mentoring is matching the mentee with a mentor who has the relevant skills and experience to meet the needs and objectives of the mentee.

To assist in this process, we ask that prospective mentors complete an Expression of Interest (EOI) form for review and approval by SportWest.

Mentees are then matched with a suitable mentor, based on the criteria contained in these EOI Forms, (completed by both mentee and mentor), the mentee's program objectives and the mentor's skill set and experience. As suitable mentors are found for each mentee, the mentors are contacted to ensure they are available for the start of the Program.

MENTOR COMMITMENT

You will need to:

- Commit to give, to help, to be direct, honest and constructive.
- Be willing to openly share your own experiences, success, failures and learnings.
- Commit to learn and grow from the people you are working with.
- Meet with your mentee at least 6 times in 6 months.
- Meet with your mentee either face to face, online, by telephone or email. Time and place of meetings to be mutually agreed between you and your mentee.
- Undertake online, self-paced, mentor training (non-compulsory).

The Program will run from July 2024 - February 2025.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Applicants must meet the following criteria to be eligible to become a mentor:

- 10+ years' experience in a senior or executive position.
- Open to all genders.
